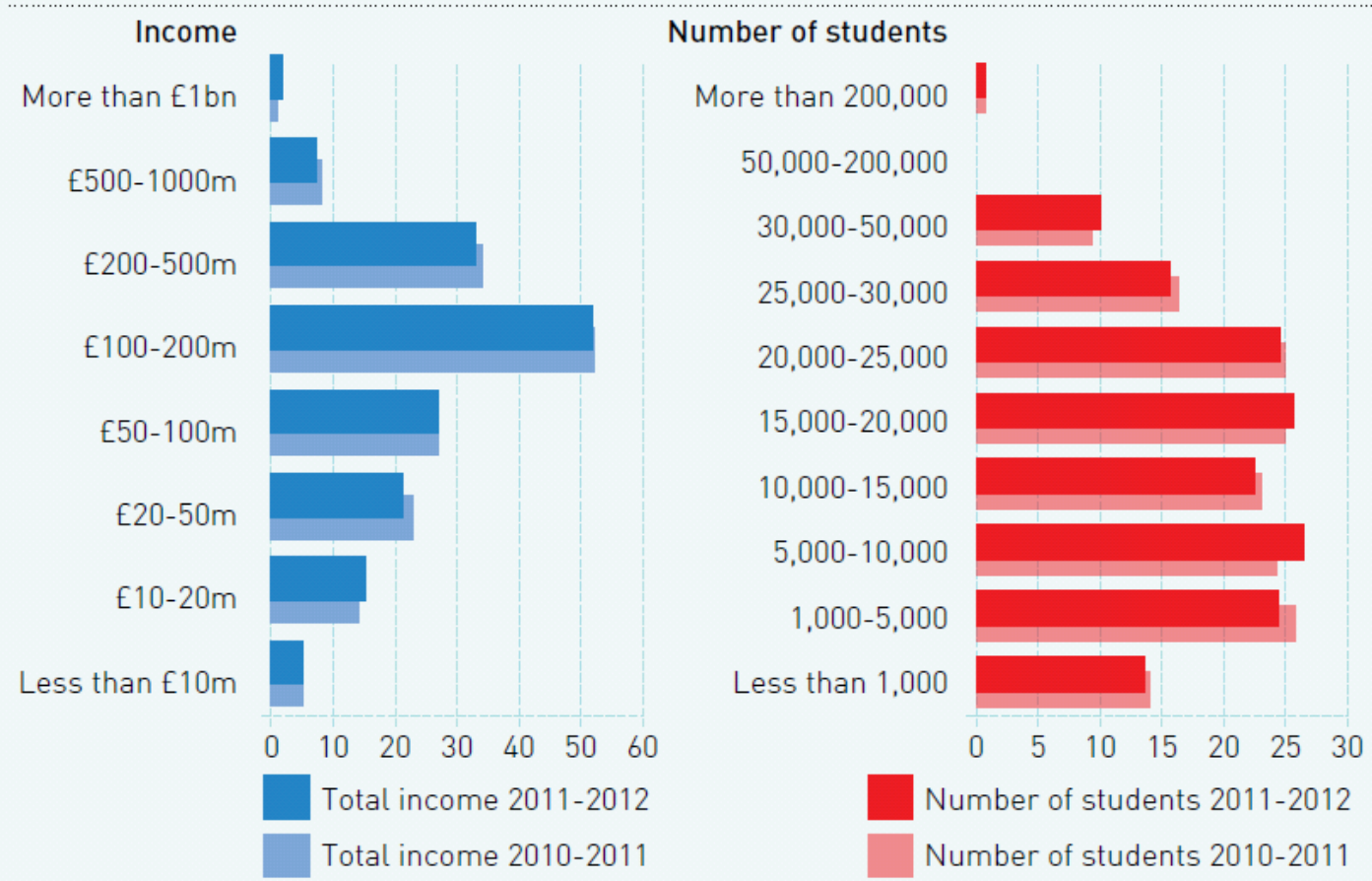


UK higher education: Overview

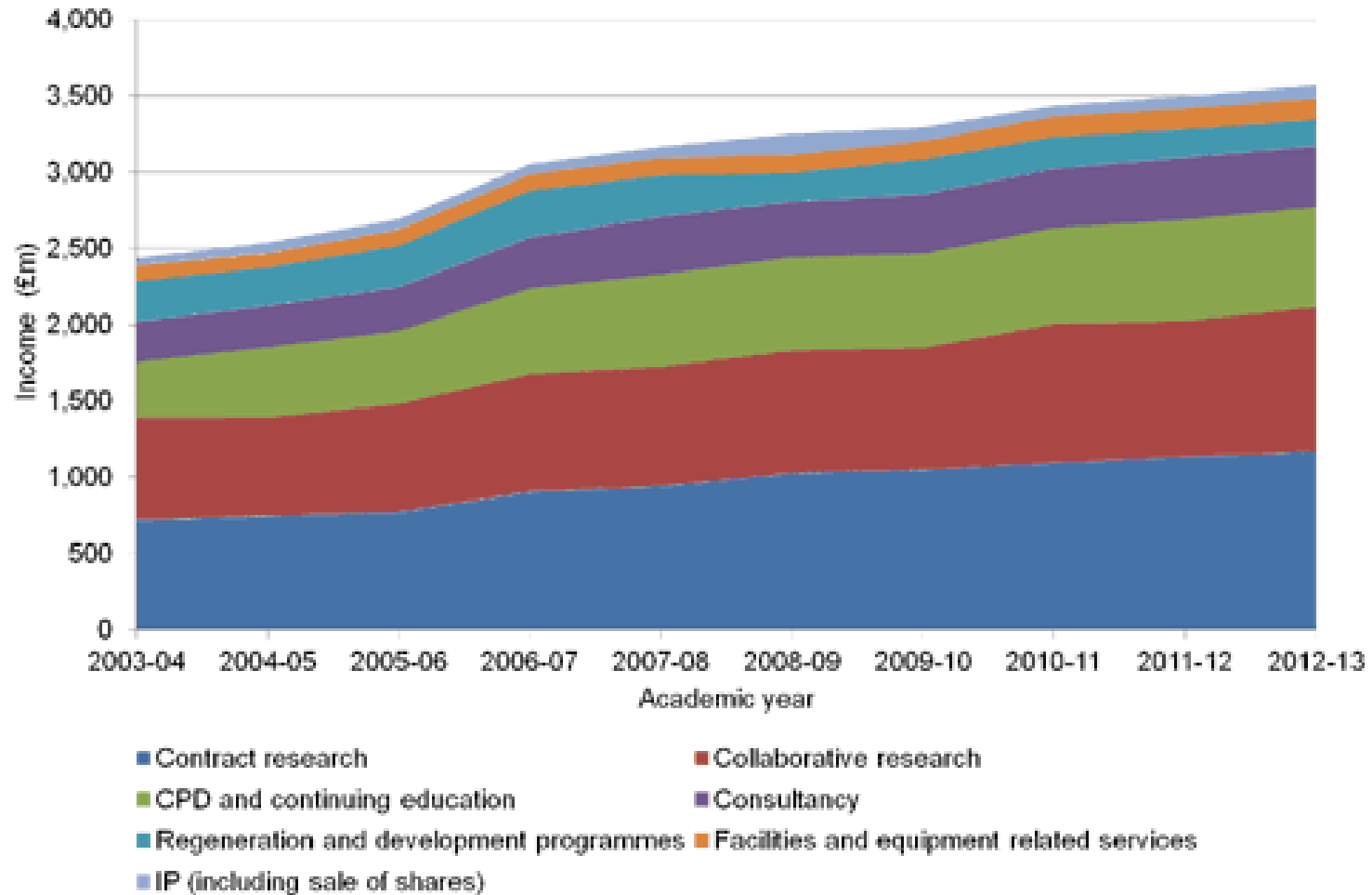

UK HE: increasingly international

- 24% of all academic HE staff and 17% of students in the UK are international
 - Increasing international research collaboration: 48% of articles have an international co-author
 - 600,000 students currently enrolled in TNE
 - 75% of UK HEIs engaged in TNE in over 200 countries
 - Second most popular destination for international students

Benefits of internationalisation

- Internationally co-authored work more likely to achieve a higher citation impact
 - internationally mobile researchers more productive
 - internationally mobile students more employable
 - Research profile attracts students, talent, investment, and higher ranking
 - Academic, cultural, prestige and financial benefits

Strong links with Indonesia

- **UK educates 1,665 students from Indonesia**
 - increased by 45% since 2009/10
 - 365 Transnational Education students in Indonesia study for UK degrees

- **Top quality research partner**
 - The UK is Indonesia's 6th largest research collaborator by co-publications
 - The highest quality major collaborator – UK-Indonesia papers have a **Field Weighted Citation Impact of 3.63**, compared to 1.18 with Japan, 2.34 with the USA and 1.76 with Australia.



UK-Indonesia DIKTI Scholarship Programme

- Aims to increase the number of Indonesian academics with a PhD or Masters' qualification
- **Open now** for permanent and prospective faculty members at Indonesian universities and administrative staff in DIKTI or Indonesian state universities
- The programme will fund up to **750** academics study in the UK over five years at over 80 universities in the UK
- **All academic subjects** will be considered for full funding

The Indonesia-UK DIKTI Scholarship Programme is now open for lecturers in Indonesia to come to study for their doctorate at many leading universities in the United Kingdom. A small number of master's scholarships will also be available. The programme will fund up to 750 academics to come and study in the UK over the next five years.

You can study at over seventy universities or higher education institutions in the UK. All academic subjects will be considered for full funding under the DIKTI scheme. More universities will be joining the scheme. Click [here](#) for details of the participating institutions and what postgraduate programmes they are offering.

Who can apply?

The scheme is open to permanent and prospective faculty members at Indonesian universities and administrative staff in DIKTI or Indonesian state universities. Click [here](#) for more information about eligibility requirements.

How do I apply?

You need to apply directly to the university that you wish to study at and follow their application process. Often you will need to submit a detailed research proposal and provide academic references. Please inform them that you are a DIKTI scholar. Click [here](#) for more information about how to apply.

What academic qualifications do I need?

For PhD study you would normally be expected to hold a Masters degree or equivalent, however in some cases, having extensive research experience in your chosen field might be enough but this varies from institution to institution and the requirements of
